Christina Wadhvani is Head Incubator Models in Public Health at the Novartis Foundation, responsible for identifying innovative health service delivery programs and opportunities in low- and middle-income settings that address non-communicable diseases (NCDs).

Prior to joining the Novartis Foundation, Christina spent two years at the World Bank headquarters in Washington, DC, exploring cost-effective interventions in low- and middle-income countries to address the dual burden of disease - the health-related Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) as well as the rising burden of NCDs.

Christina received her MPH from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health with a concentration in Health in Crisis and Humanitarian Assistance. She subsequently served as a Research Scholar for the Johns Hopkins National Center for the Study of Preparedness and Catastrophic Event Response (PACER) and worked in Hanoi with the Harvard Medical School AIDS Initiative in Vietnam (HAIVN) analyzing the impact of HIV/AIDS health worker training and stigma reduction programs. She also spent two years in New Orleans supporting community members affected by Hurricane Katrina.

Christina is currently obtaining her PhD at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (LSHTM). She received her Bachelor's in Public Health at the George Washington University.
